


My Visit to the Eat, Make, Share: A Taste of Immigration Exhibition



I am going to visit the eat make share: a taste of immigration, an exhibition at the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21.

I will find the exhibition on the ground floor of the museum behind where I got my ticket

In this exhibition I can learn about and food and immigration to Canada.



I can get a sensory kit from the Ticket Counter with tools that may help me during my visit.




I enter the eat make share: a taste of immigration exhibition through the Chiodo Foyer.

In the Chiodo Foyer I can hear the sounds of a busy market place, I can use ear defenders if it is too loud.



There is fake food in the foyer I can touch and look at the fake food, but I can not eat it.



I can't bring open food or drinks past the wooden doors. I can leave food or drinks on the table by the door until I am done in the exhibition.





When I enter the room there will be sounds of music and voices from parts of the exhibit. I can cover my ears or take a break and leave the exhibition if it gets too loud.

I can select what language I want to hear by pressing buttons on the displays. I may need to pick up a phone to hear the audio



Some spaces may be dark or loud I can use ear defenders or look from a comfortable distance.






There are parts of the exhibit I can touch and explore.




If I open the lid I can smell spruce tea, the smell can be strong I can keep the lid closed.
