Annual Report on the Administration of the Access to Information Act April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024

# **1. Introduction**

The Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21 (the Museum) is pleased to provide its annual report on the administration of the *Access to Information Act* (the *Act*) for the fiscal year 2023-24 as required under section 94 of the *Act*. In accordance with the *Act*, this report is tabled in Parliament.

The Access to Information Act is based on the following principles:

- Government information should be made available to Canadians and permanent residents of Canada;
- Exceptions to the right of access should be limited and specific, and;
- Decisions on the disclosure of government information should be reviewed independently of government.

### Mandate

On November 25, 2010, the legislation creating the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21 came into effect. Under the *Museums Act*, the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21 is a distinct legal entity, wholly-owned by the Crown. It operates at arm's length from the Government in its day-to-day operations and in its activities and programming.

Situated at Pier 21, a National Historic Site at the Port of Halifax, the Government established the Museum as a Crown corporation within the Canadian Heritage portfolio. It is one of only two national museums to be created in a generation and the second to be located outside of the National Capital Region.

The amendments to the *Museums Act* established the Museum's mandate as follows:

The purpose of the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21 is to explore the theme of immigration to Canada in order to enhance public understanding of the experiences of immigrants as they arrived in Canada, of the vital role immigration has played in the building of Canada and of the contributions of immigrants to Canada's culture, economy and way of life. The Museum's public policy role is expressed in the preamble of the *Museums Act*, which states each national museum:

- a) "plays an essential role, individually and together with other museums and like institutions, in preserving and promoting the heritage of Canada and all its peoples throughout Canada and abroad, and in contributing to the collective memory and sense of identity of all Canadians;" and
- *b) "is a source of inspiration, research, learning and entertainment that belongs to all Canadians and provides, in both official languages, a service that is essential to Canadian culture and available to all."*

The Museum had no non-operational ("paper") subsidiaries during this reporting period.

The Annual Reports for the administration of both the *Access to Information Act* and *Privacy Act* have been submitted and tabled to Parliament.

# 2. Organizational Structure

The Museum is presided over by a Board of Trustees currently consisting of nine members from across Canada and appointed by the Minister with the approval of the Governor in Council. The first Director of the Museum, who is the Chief Executive Officer, was appointed on October 20, 2011, and is responsible for the operation and administration of the Corporation.

The Museum's Senior Writer serves as the Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator. The Museum has no other staff nor consultants working in this area.

The Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator is responsible for administering the *Access to Information Act* within the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21, with a mandate to act on behalf of the Director and CEO in ensuring compliance with legislation, regulations and government policy and to create directives and standards in all matters relating to the *Act*. This includes the processing of access requests and providing professional advice and training.

The Museum does not have any service agreements per section 96 of the Act.

# 3. Delegation Order

Pursuant to Section 95 (1) of the *Access to Information Act*, the Museum has delegated authority to the Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator to exercise or perform all powers, duties and functions of the CEO and Director under the *Act* 

insofar as they may be exercised or performed in relation to the Museum. The delegation order is attached as Appendix A.

# 4. Performance in 2023-24

Details on performance in the 2023-24 fiscal year can be found in the Statistical Report on the *Access to Information Act* and the Supplemental Statistical Report on the Impact of COVID-19 measures, attached as Appendix B.

In summary:

- The Museum received one formal request under the *Access to Information Act* during the reporting period.
- There were no active requests at the end of the previous fiscal year.
- All active requests were completed within the legislated timeline of 30 days.
- All requests (100%) were "all disclosed".
- There were no active complaints as of the end of the fiscal year.
- During the reporting period, the Museum received no requests for consultation.
- There were no access to information packages released informally.

# **5. Training and Awareness**

There were no formal training sessions on the *Access to Information* and *Privacy Acts* during the reporting period.

# 6. Policies, Guidelines and Procedures

No new Museum-specific policies, guidelines, procedures or initiatives were developed in 2023-24. The Museum follows Treasury Board policies and directives.

Due to the low volume, the Museum does not have a formal system to monitor the time to process access to information requests. The Access to Information and Privacy Coordinator ensures requests are processed within the 30-day time period. In the event of a delay or extension, the CEO is notified and updated on the status of the request.
